



Wales for Peace – Volunteering Opportunities

Learning Resources Volunteers

Description of role: We are looking for volunteers who can help us to research hidden histories from Wales' peace heritage over the last hundred years and turn them into accessible learning resources, linked to the Welsh curriculum. Stories will concentrate on key themes being explored by the Wales for Peace project — including soldiers' stories, histories of peacemakers, asylum seekers and refugees, international cooperation and the role of women. The resources will be made available bilingually online.

Time Commitment: This is a flexible opportunity. Ideally, you would be able to volunteer for at least 4 hours a week.

What you will do: This role includes identifying gaps in the story we have uncovered to date, identifying key materials such as documents, photos, sound clips, newspaper articles etc, and producing learning materials which help learners to engage with them critically and to respond creatively.

Who would this role suit? This role would suit people with experience of teaching, or students of education, also historians and people with an interest in peace. It will also suit people with an interest in one of the following: Wales' role in internationalism and peace, the history of Wales in the 20th Century.

Some of the benefits: Support will be available in the form of guidance from the Learning Coordinator and sample materials already produced. Through this role volunteers will have the opportunity to develop research skills, and to adapt materials to the educational context.
